

Jimena Nieto Carrasco is a lawyer with a Master of Law (LLM) in Public International Law from the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE), London, United Kingdom and possesses a *Certificat d'études politiques at the Institut d'Etudes Politiques de Paris*.

In her capacity as Head of the International Affairs Office of the Colombian Ministry of Environment, in the period 1993 – 2003 and as Coordinator for Environmental Affairs at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 2007-2008, Ms. Nieto participated in numerous international negotiations on issues related to climate change, biodiversity, hazardous substances and wastes. She is currently the Chair of the Implementation and Compliance Committee of the Basel Convention and she is also chairing the Compliance Committee of the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety and is also a member of the Facilitative Branch of the Compliance Mechanism of the Kyoto Protocol. Mrs. Nieto co-chaired the contact group on compliance during the negotiations of the Minamata Convention on Mercury, the contact group on compliance that was established during the “Triple COP” of the Basel, Rotterdam and Stockholm Conventions and she co-chaired the contact group on compliance under the Nagoya Protocol to the Convention on Biological Diversity.

Currently she works as an Adviser for the international Affairs Office at the Ministry of Environment and Sustainable Development of Colombia and she is a Professor of International Environmental Law, in undergraduate and postgraduate programmes at the Universidad de los Andes, Universidad del Rosario and Universidad Externado de Colombia.
